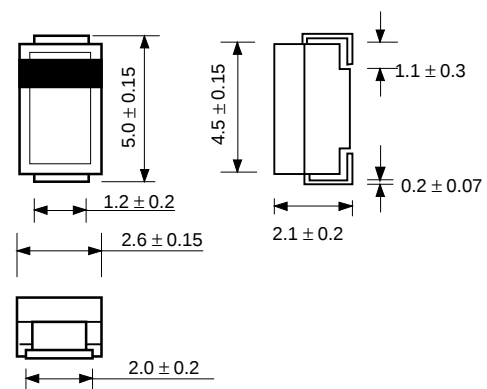

(FR-4 BOARD WITH MINIMUM PAD)**

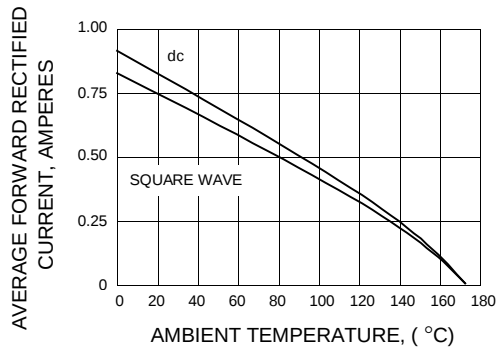
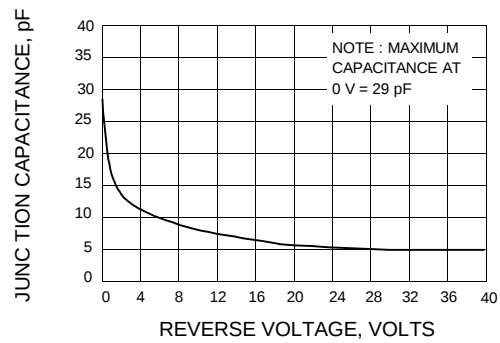


FIG.2 - MAXIMUM JUNCTION CAPACITANCE

FORWARD VOLTAGE**

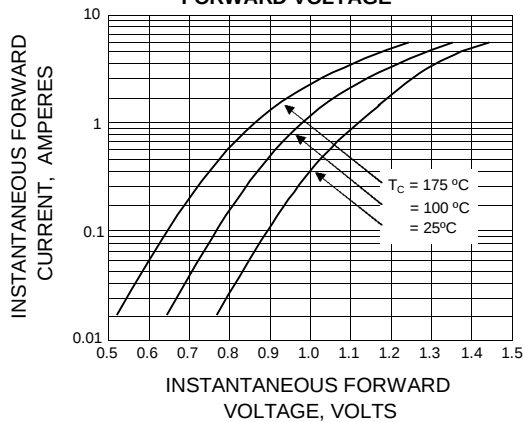


FIG. 4 - MAXIMUM REVERSE CURRENT

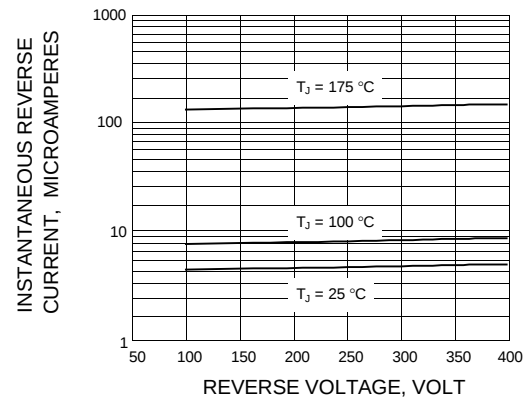


FIG. 5 - POWER DISSIPATION
