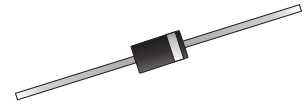

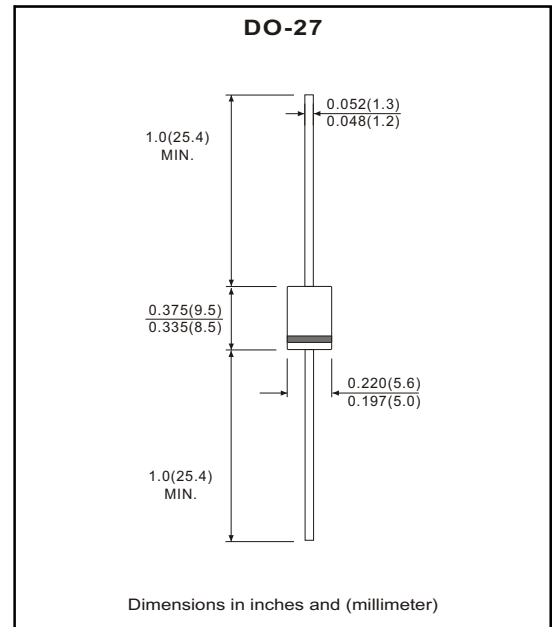

Fig.1 Typical Forward Current Derating Curve

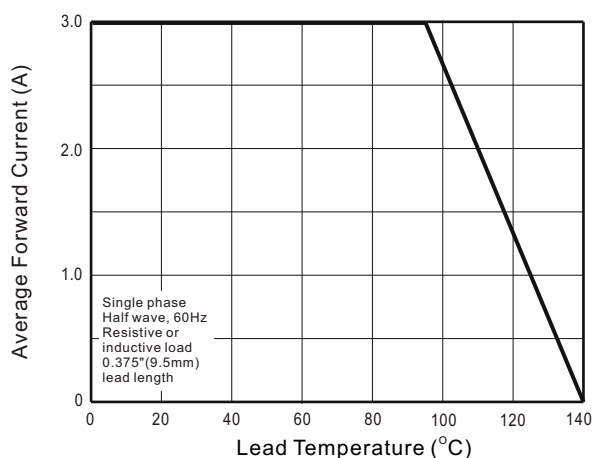


Fig.2 Maximum Non-repetitive Peak Forward Surge Current

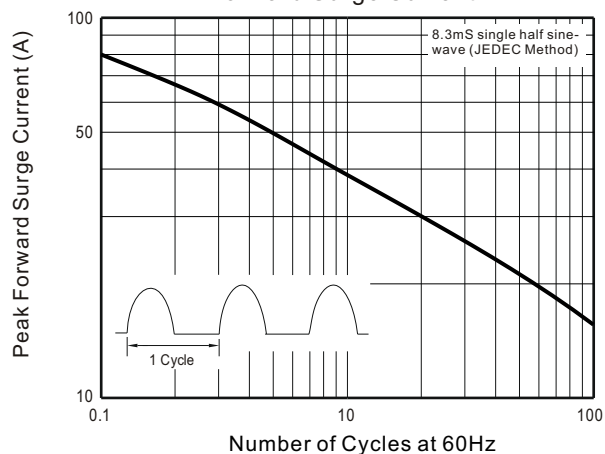


Fig.3 Typical Instantaneous Forward Characteristics

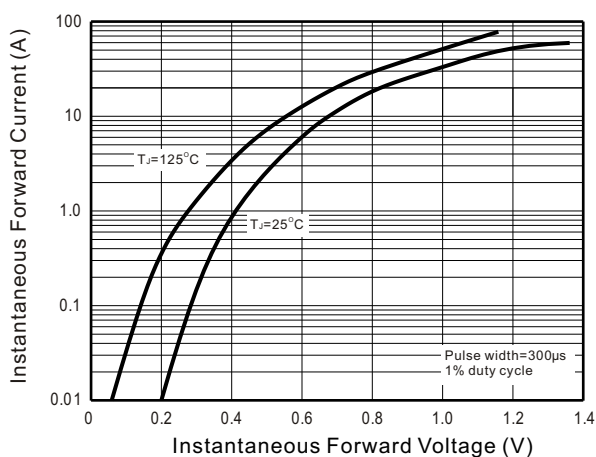


Fig.4 Typical Reverse Characteristics

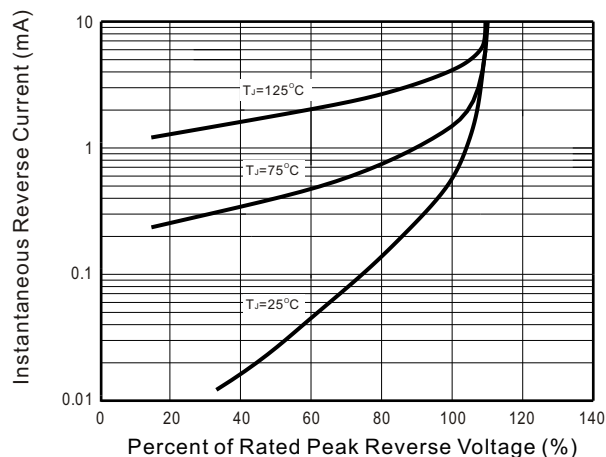


Fig.5 Typical Junction Capacitance
