
DESCRIPTION

The PS9113 is an optically coupled isolator containing a GaAlAs LED on the input side and a photo diode and a signal processing circuit on the output side on one chip.

The PS9113 is specified high CMR, high CTR and pulse width distortion with operating temperature. It is suitable for IPM drive.



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

PACKAGE DIMENSIONS (UNIT: mm)

*3 Test circuit for common mode transient immunity





USAGE CAUTIONS


1. This product is weak for static electricity by designed with high-speed integrated circuit so protect against static electricity when handling.
2. By-pass capacitor of $0.1 \mu\text{F}$ is used between V_{cc} and GND near device. Also, ensure that the distance between the leads of the photocoupler and capacitor is no more than 10 mm.
3. Avoid storage at a high temperature and high humidity.


MAXIMUM FORWARD CURRENT vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE




DETECTOR POWER DISSIPATION vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE




FORWARD CURRENT vs. FORWARD VOLTAGE




SUPPLY CURRENT vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE



THRESHOLD INPUT CURRENT vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE









LOW LEVEL OUTPUT VOLTAGE vs. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE







Tape Direction






Outline and Dimensions (Reel)

<R> RECOMMENDED MOUNT PAD DIMENSIONS (UNIT: mm)




NOTES ON HANDLING

1. Recommended soldering conditions

(1) Infrared reflow soldering

- Peak reflow temperature 260°C or below (package surface temperature)
- Time of peak reflow temperature 10 seconds or less
- Time of temperature higher than 220°C 60 seconds or less
- Time to preheat temperature from 120 to 180°C 120±30 s
- Number of reflows Three
- Flux Rosin flux containing small amount of chlorine (The flux with a maximum chlorine content of 0.2 Wt% is recommended.)

(2) Wave soldering

- Temperature 260°C or below (molten solder temperature)
- Time 10 seconds or less
- Preheating conditions 120°C or below (package surface temperature)
- Number of times One (Allowed to be dipped in solder including plastic mold portion.)
- Flux Rosin flux containing small amount of chlorine (The flux with a maximum chlorine content of 0.2 Wt% is recommended.)

(3) Soldering by Soldering Iron

- Peak Temperature (lead part temperature) 350°C or below
- Time (each pins) 3 seconds or less
- Flux Rosin flux containing small amount of chlorine (The flux with a maximum chlorine content of 0.2 Wt% is recommended.)

- (a) Soldering of leads should be made at the point 1.5 to 2.0 mm from the root of the lead
- (b) Please be sure that the temperature of the package would not be heated over 100°C

(4) Cautions

- Fluxes

Avoid removing the residual flux with freon-based and chlorine-based cleaning solvent.

2. Cautions regarding noise

Be aware that when voltage is applied suddenly between the photocoupler's input and output or between collector-emitters at startup, the output transistor may enter the on state, even if the voltage is within the absolute maximum ratings.
