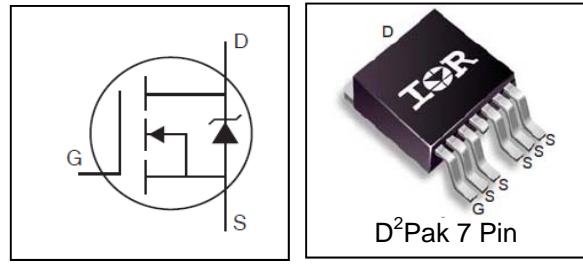
## Description

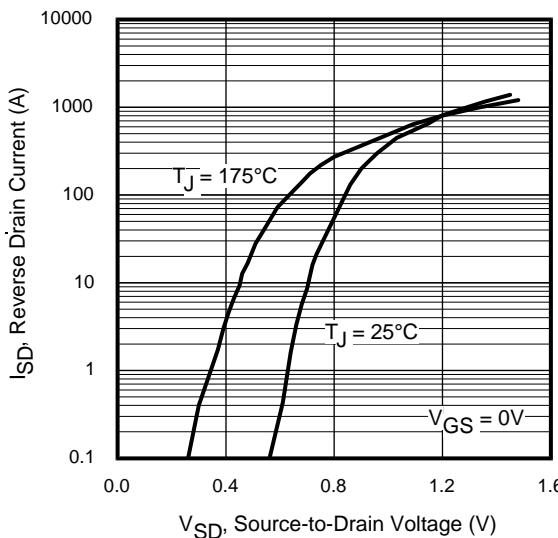


Fig. 7 Typical Source-to-Drain Diode

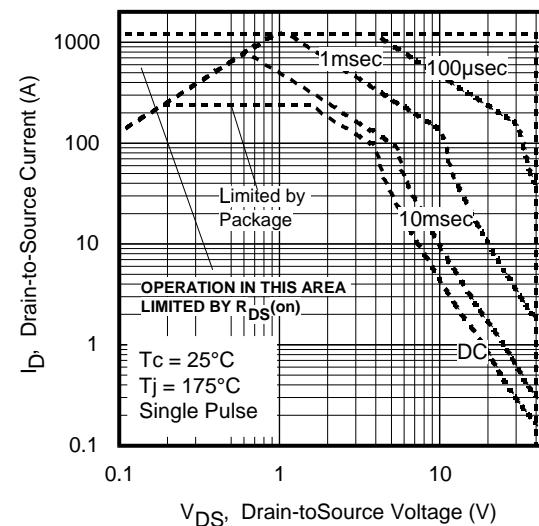


Fig 8. Maximum Safe Operating Area

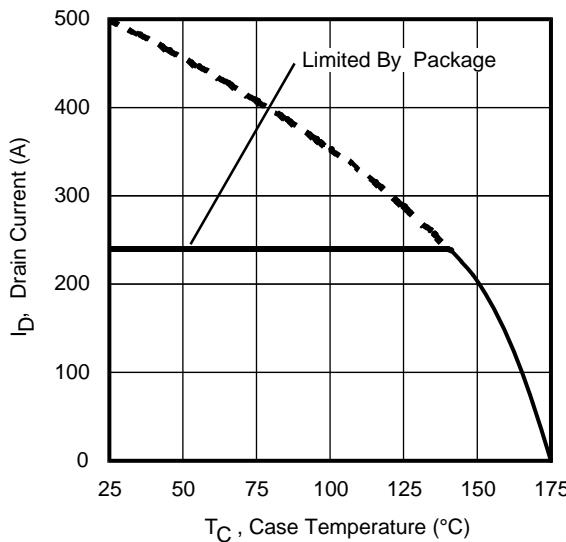


Fig 9. Maximum Drain Current vs. Case Temperature

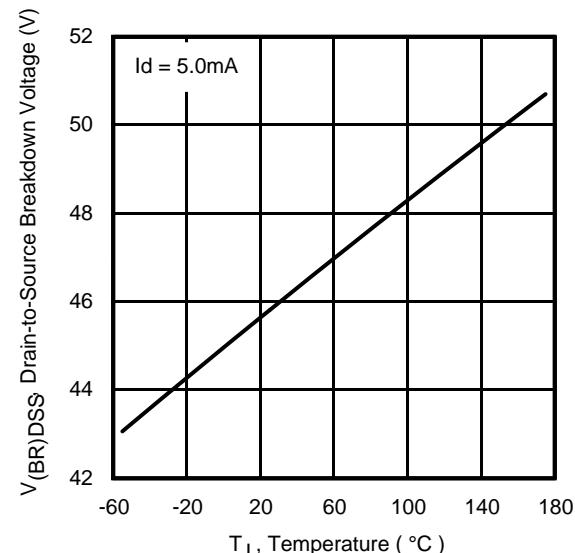


Fig 10. Drain-to-Source Breakdown Voltage

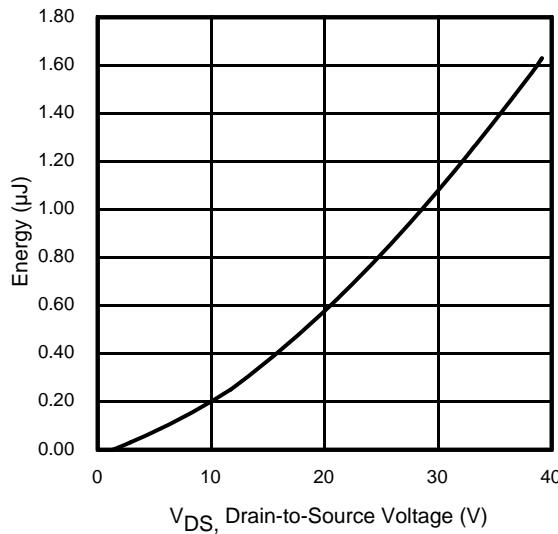


Fig 11. Typical Coss Stored Energy

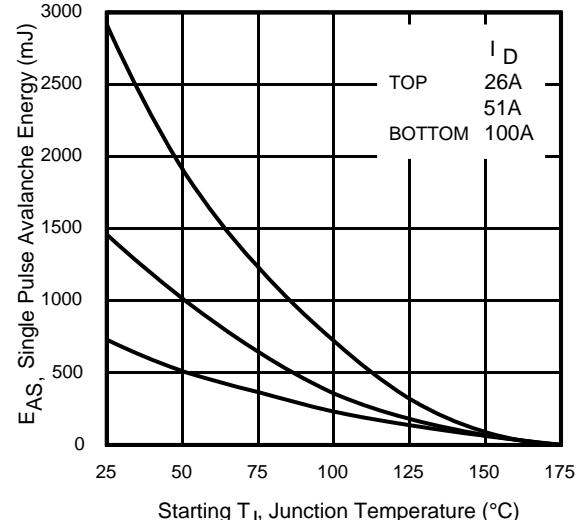


Fig 12. Maximum Avalanche Energy vs. Drain Current

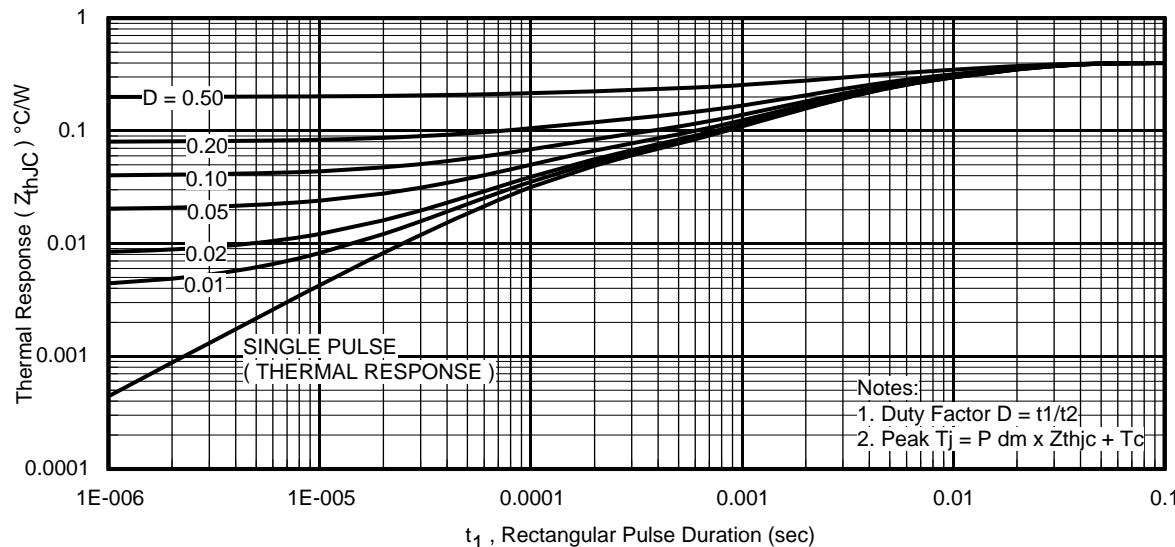


Fig 13. Maximum Effective Transient Thermal Impedance, Junction-to-Case

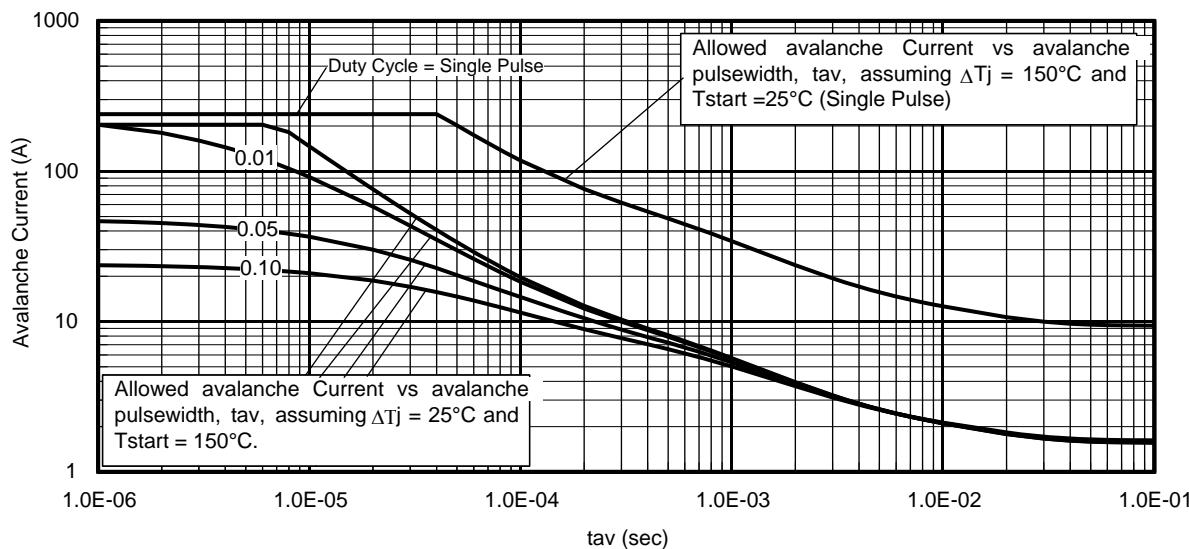
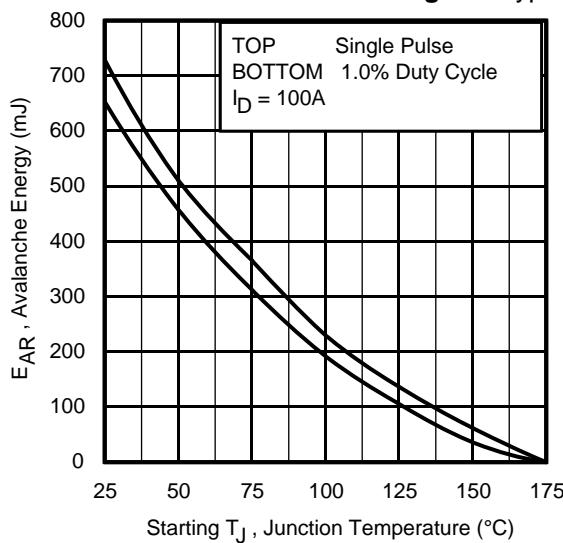


Fig 14. Typical Avalanche Current vs. Pulse width

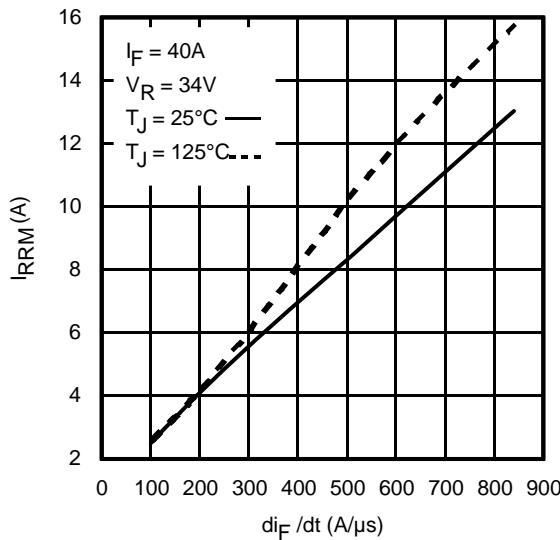
Fig 15. Maximum Avalanche Energy vs. Temperature

#### Notes on Repetitive Avalanche Curves , Figures 14, 15: (For further info, see AN-1005 at [www.irf.com](http://www.irf.com))

1. Avalanche failures assumption: Purely a thermal phenomenon and failure occurs at a temperature far in excess of  $T_{jmax}$ . This is validated for every part type.

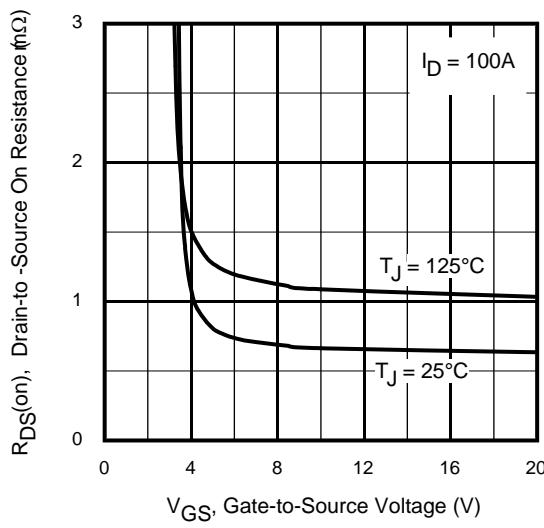

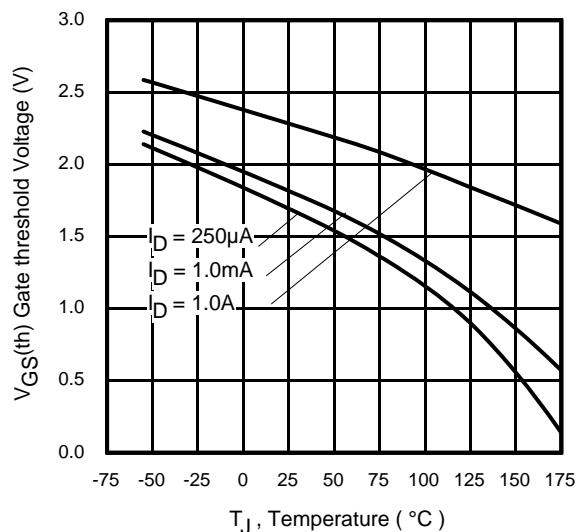

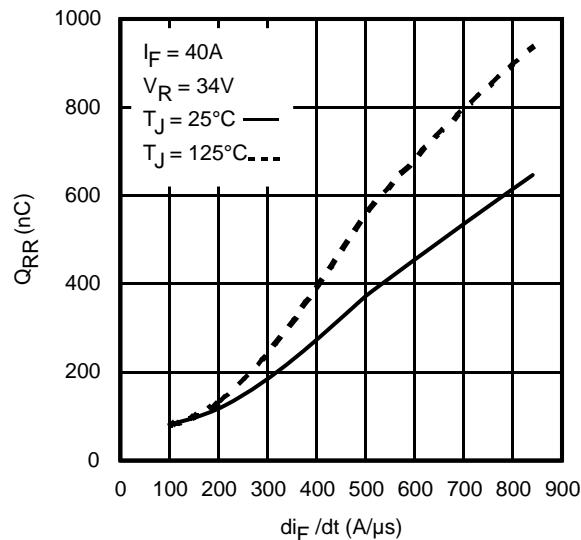
**Fig 16.** Typical On-Resistance vs. Gate Voltage



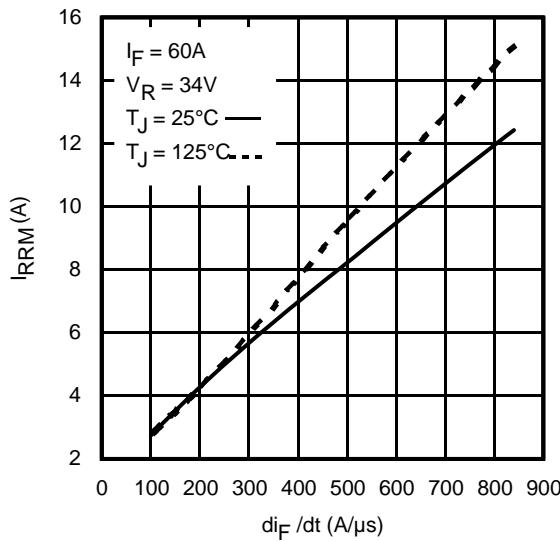
**Fig 17.** Threshold Voltage vs. Temperature



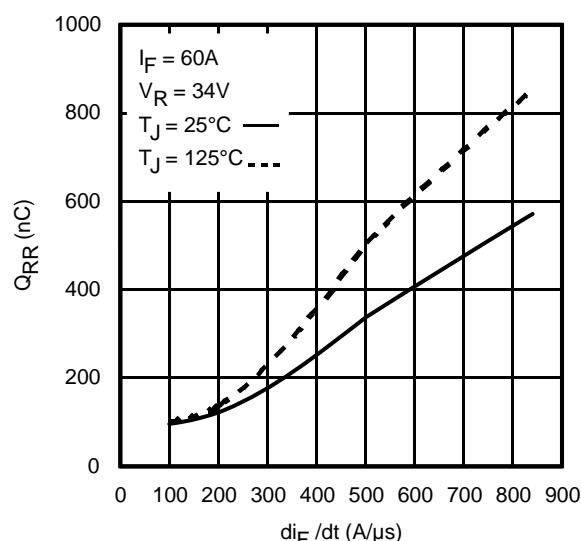
**Fig. 18 -** Typical Recovery Current vs.  $di_F/dt$



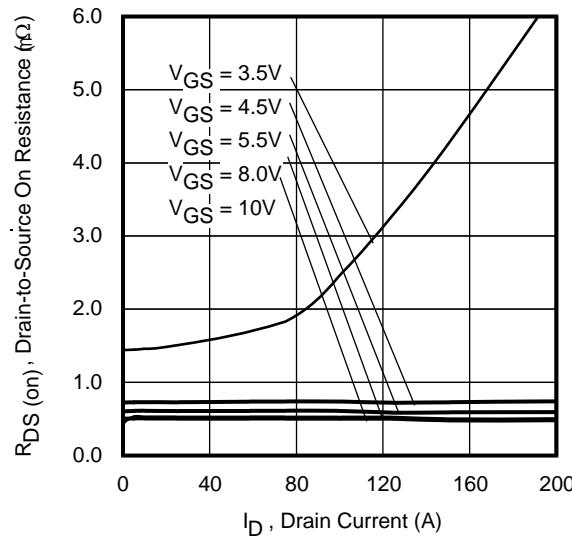
**Fig. 19 -** Typical Stored Charge vs.  $di_F/dt$

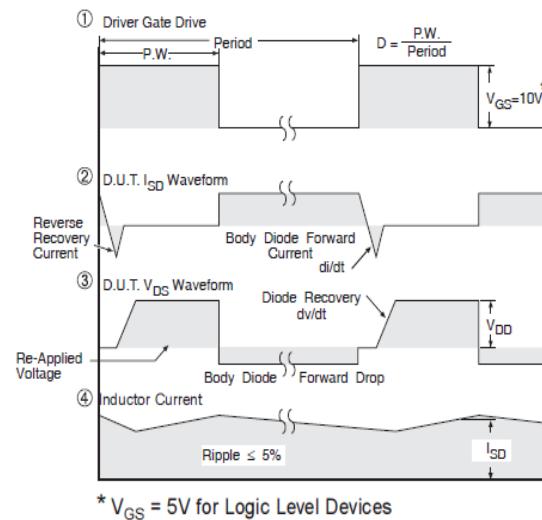
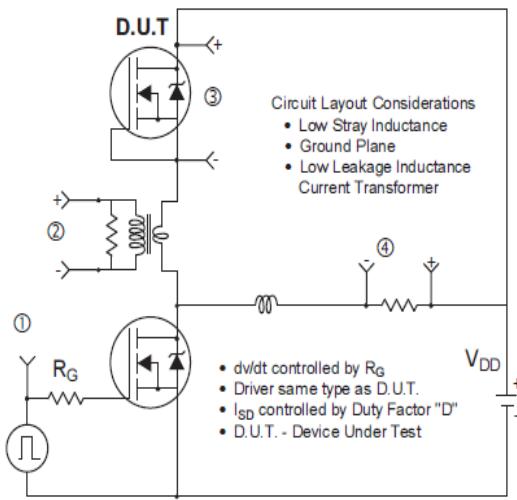


Fig 22. Peak Diode Recovery  $dv/dt$  Test Circuit for N-Channel HEXFET® Power MOSFETs

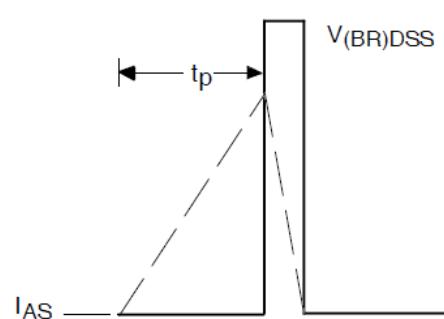
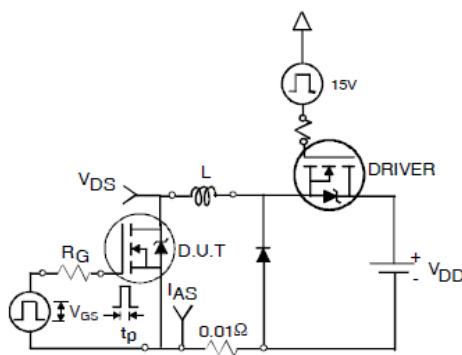


Fig 22a. Unclamped Inductive Test Circuit

Fig 22b. Unclamped Inductive Waveforms

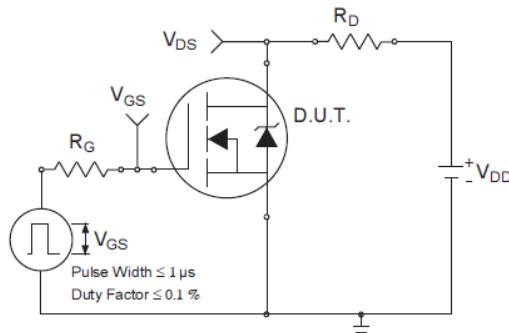


Fig 23a. Switching Time Test Circuit

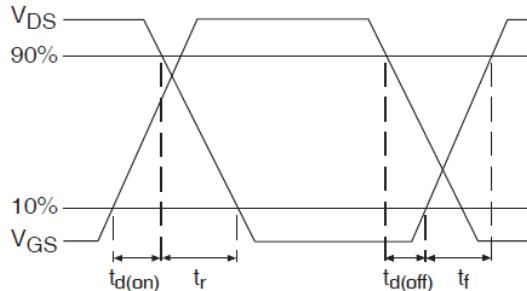


Fig 23b. Switching Time Waveforms

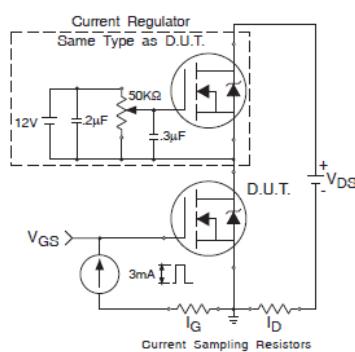


Fig 24a. Gate Charge Test Circuit

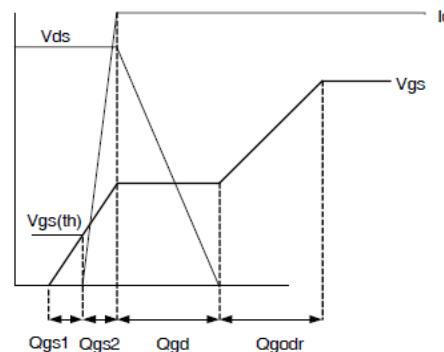
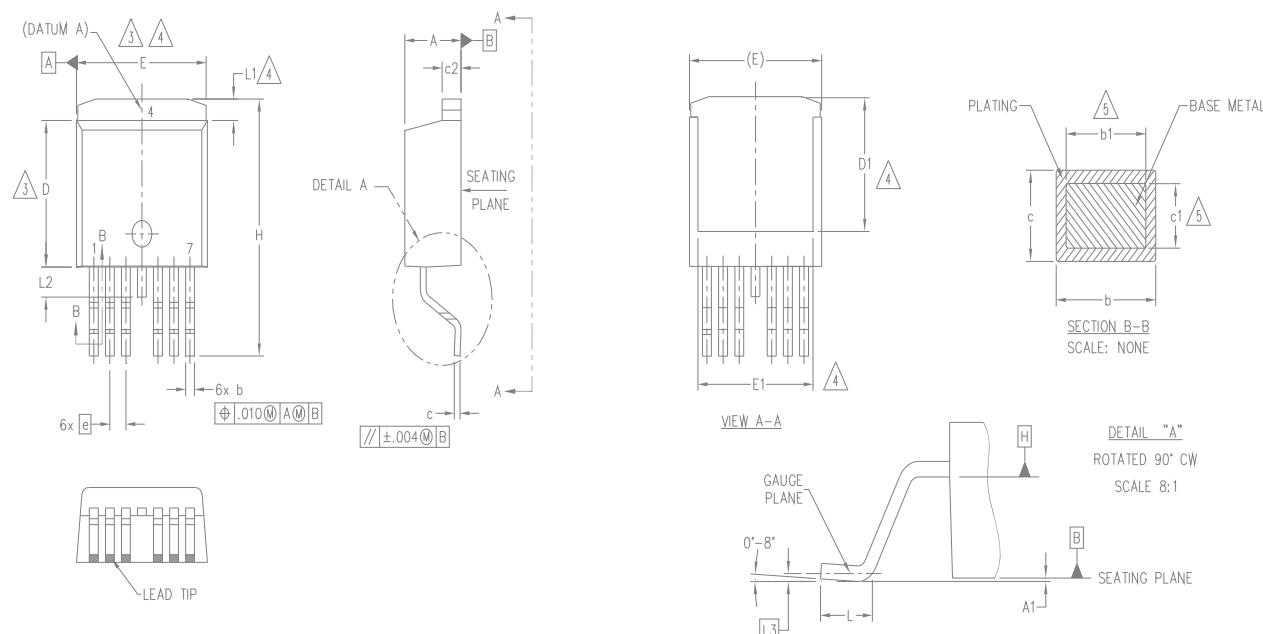


Fig 24b. Gate Charge Waveform

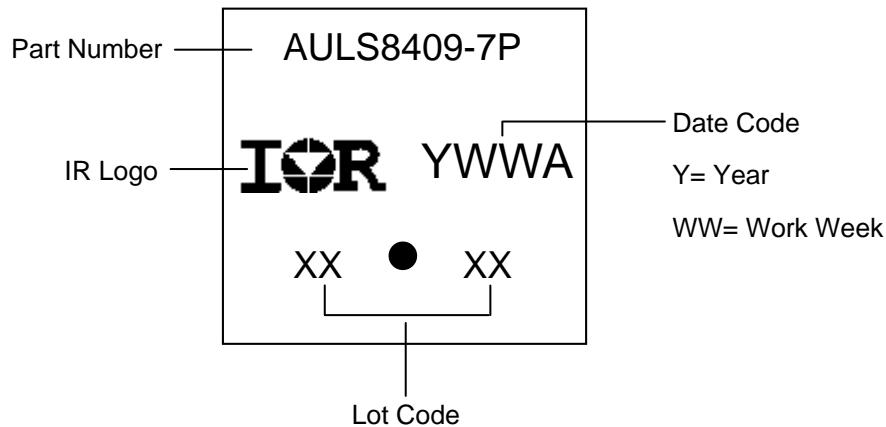

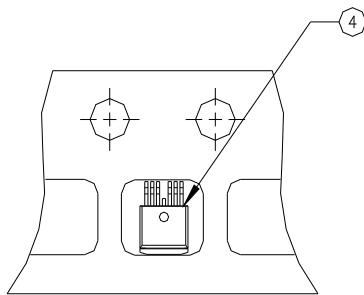

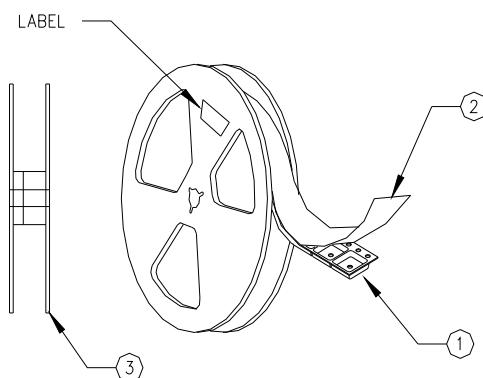
