Please note: For MOSFET paralleling the use of ferrite beads on the gate or separate totem poles is generally recommended.

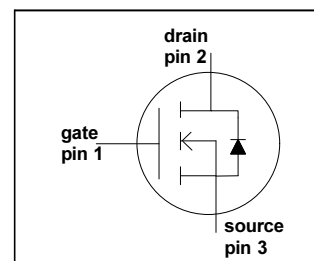
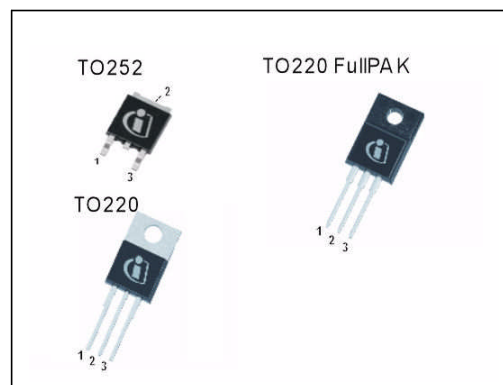

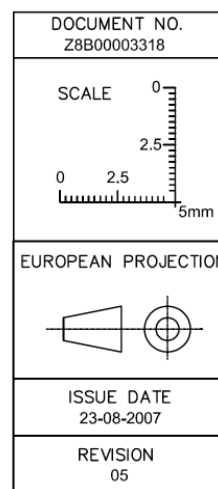
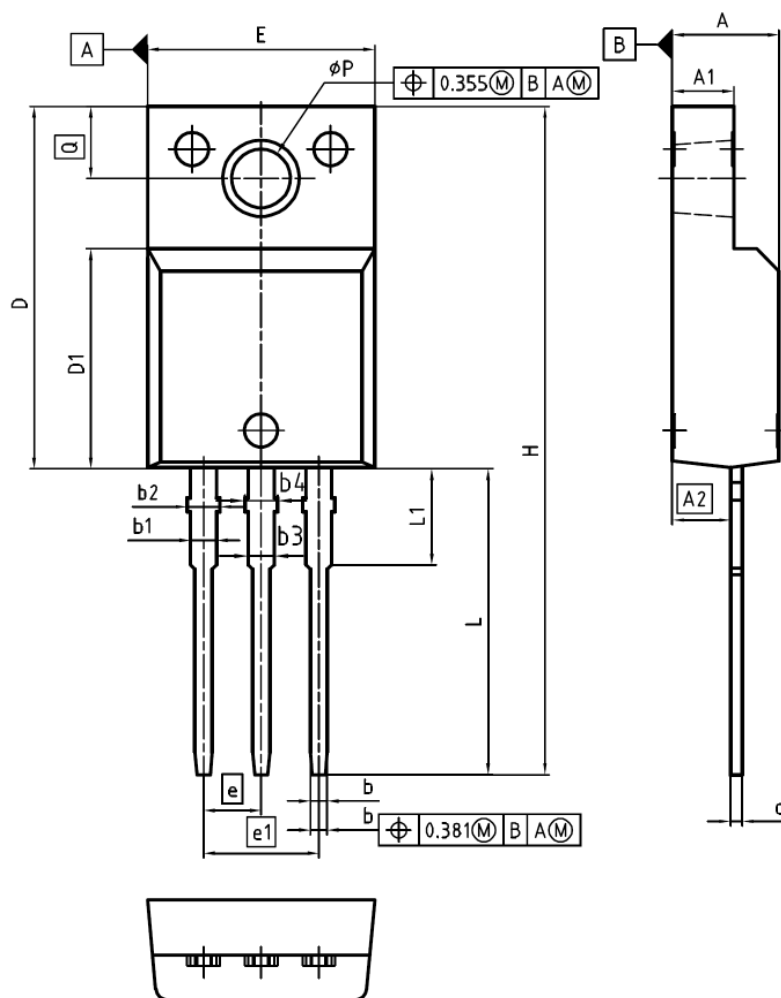


Figure 1 Outlines TO-220, dimensions in mm/inches

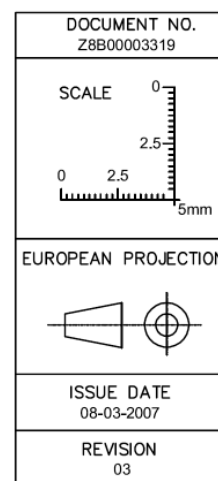
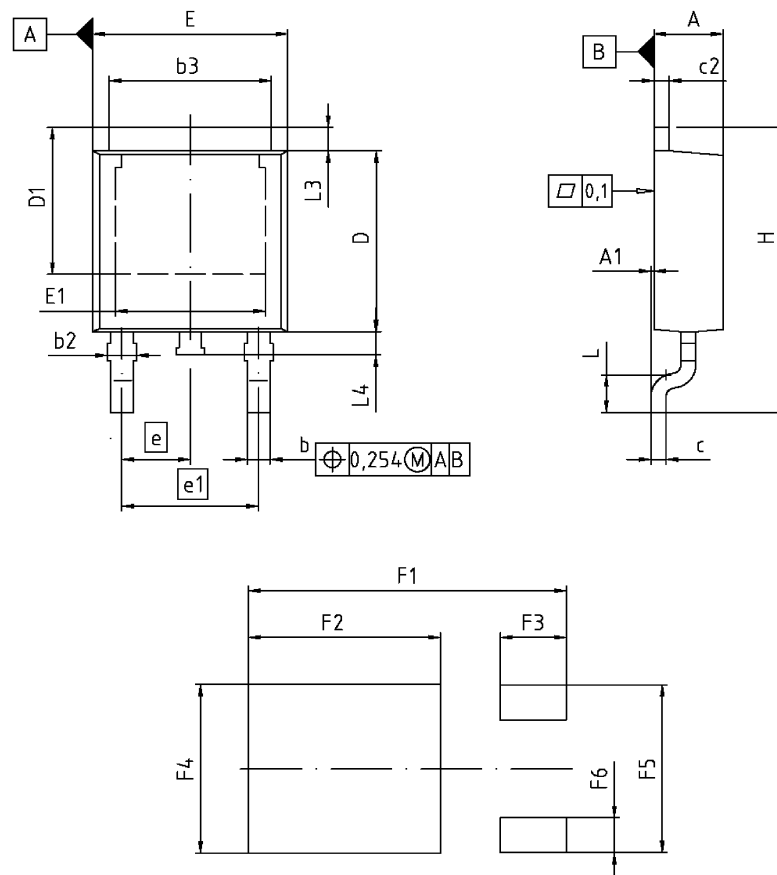


Figure 2 Outlines TO-220 FullPAK, dimensions in mm/inches

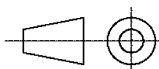
