Planar passivated Silicon Controlled Rectifier (SCR) in a SOT186A (TO-220F) "full pack" plastic package intended for use in applications requiring very high inrush current capability, high thermal cycling performance and high junction temperature capability ($T_{j(max)} = 150^\circ\text{C}$).

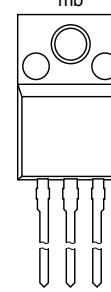

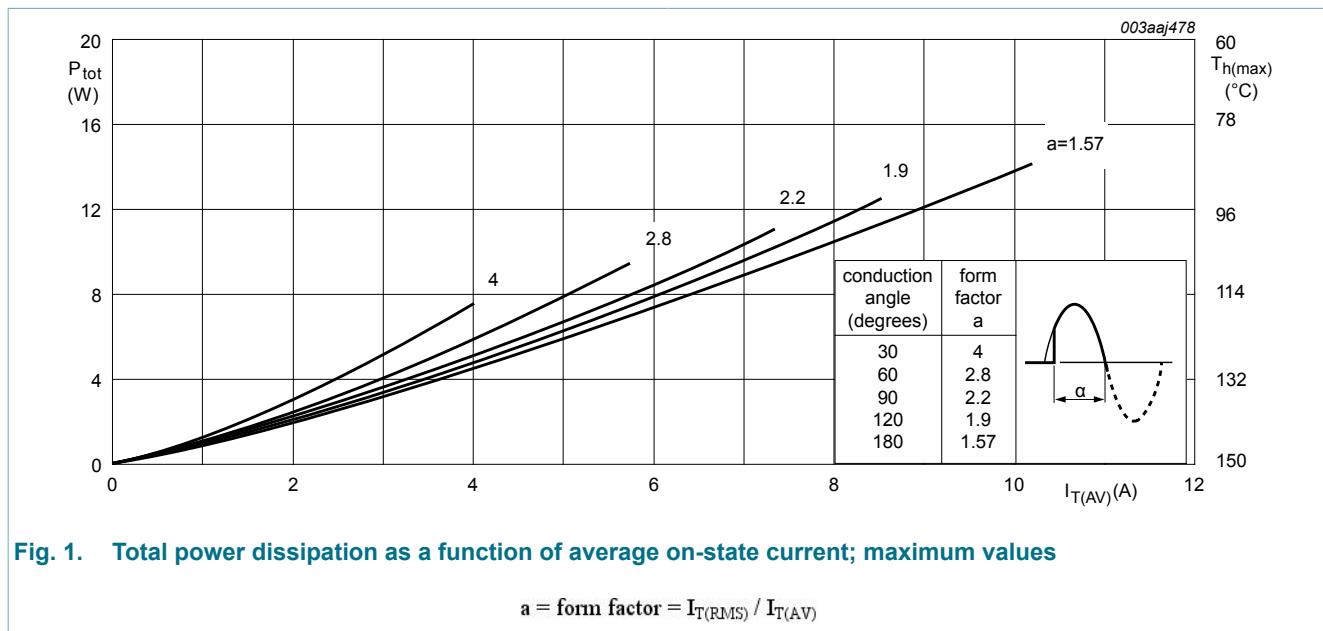


Fig. 1. Total power dissipation as a function of average on-state current; maximum values

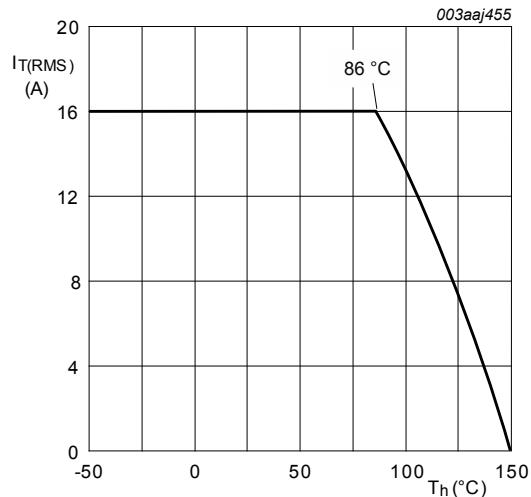


Fig. 2. RMS on-state current as a function of heatsink temperature; maximum values

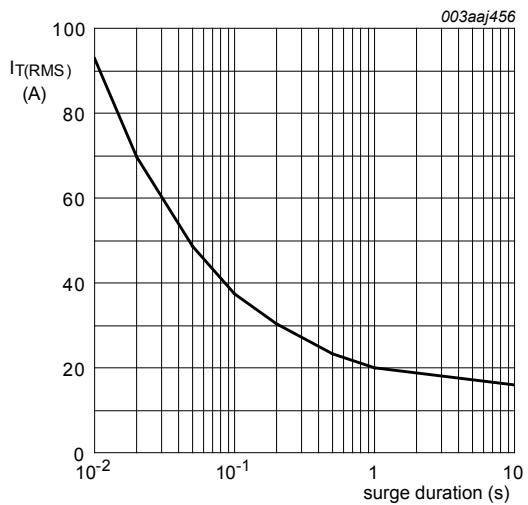


Fig. 3. RMS on-state current as a function of surge duration; maximum values

$f = 50$ Hz; $T_h = 86$ °C

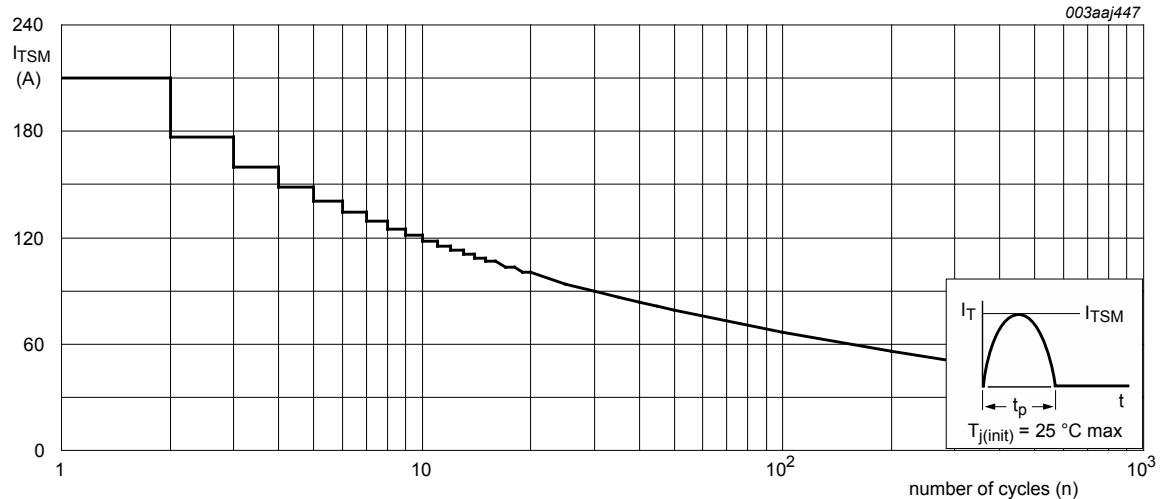


Fig. 4. Non-repetitive peak on-state current as a function of the number of sinusoidal current cycles; maximum values

$f = 50$ Hz

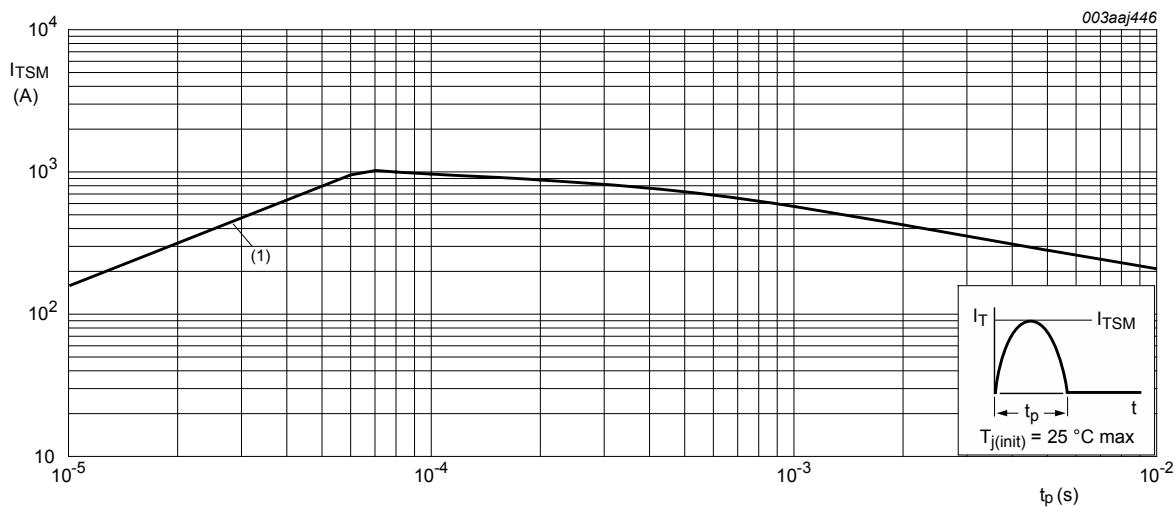


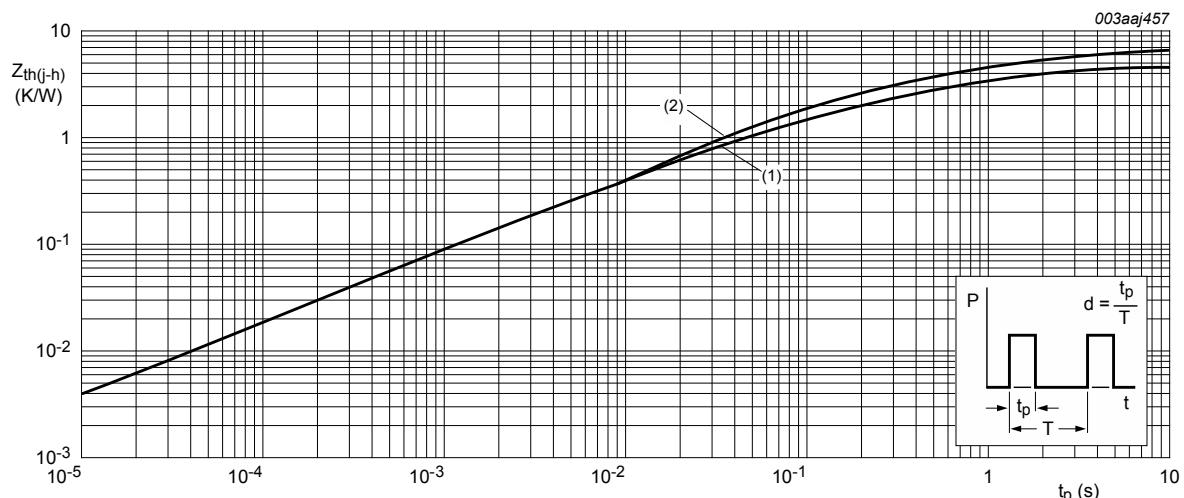
Fig. 5. Non-repetitive peak on-state current as a function of pulse width for sinusoidal currents; maximum values

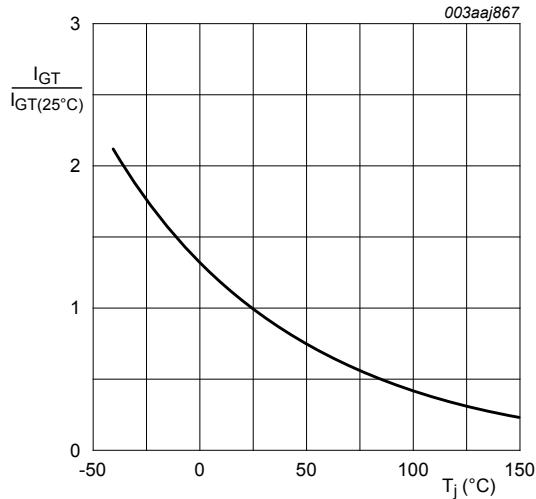


Fig. 7. Normalized gate trigger current as a function of junction temperature

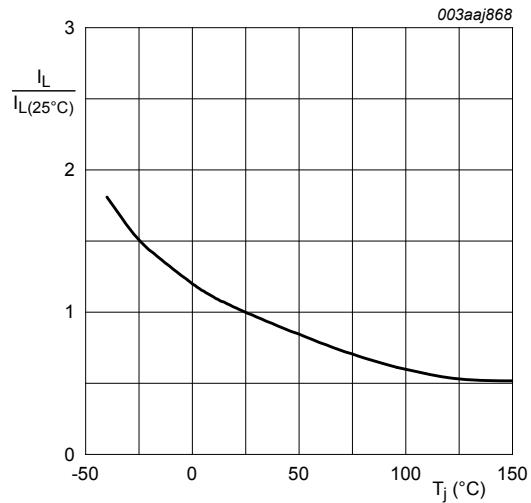


Fig. 8. Normalized latching current as a function of junction temperature

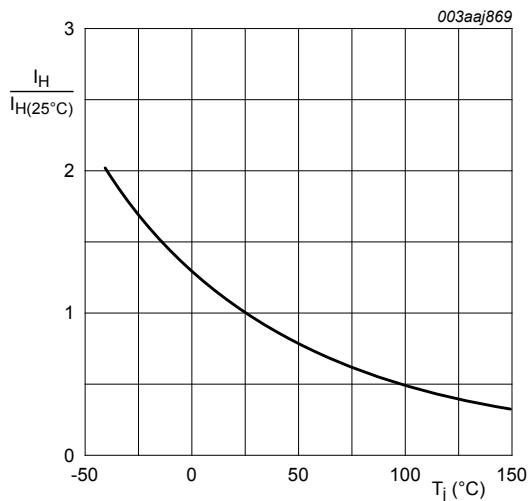
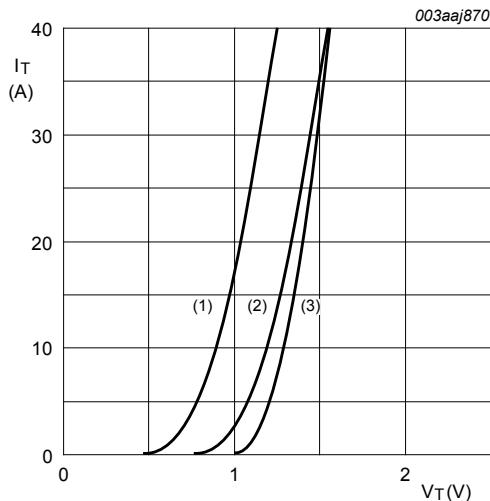


Fig. 9. Normalized holding current as a function of junction temperature

Fig. 10. On-state current as a function of on-state voltage

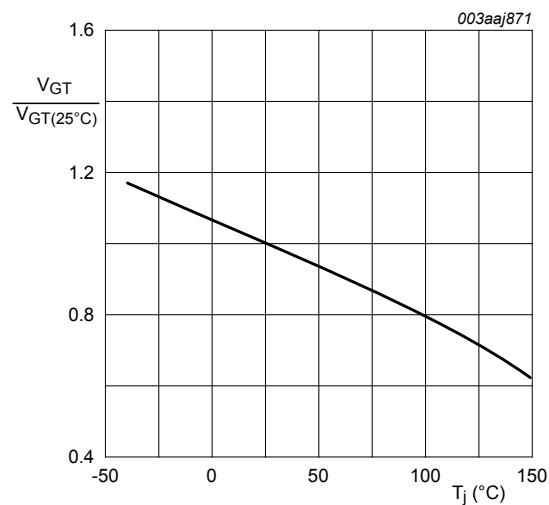
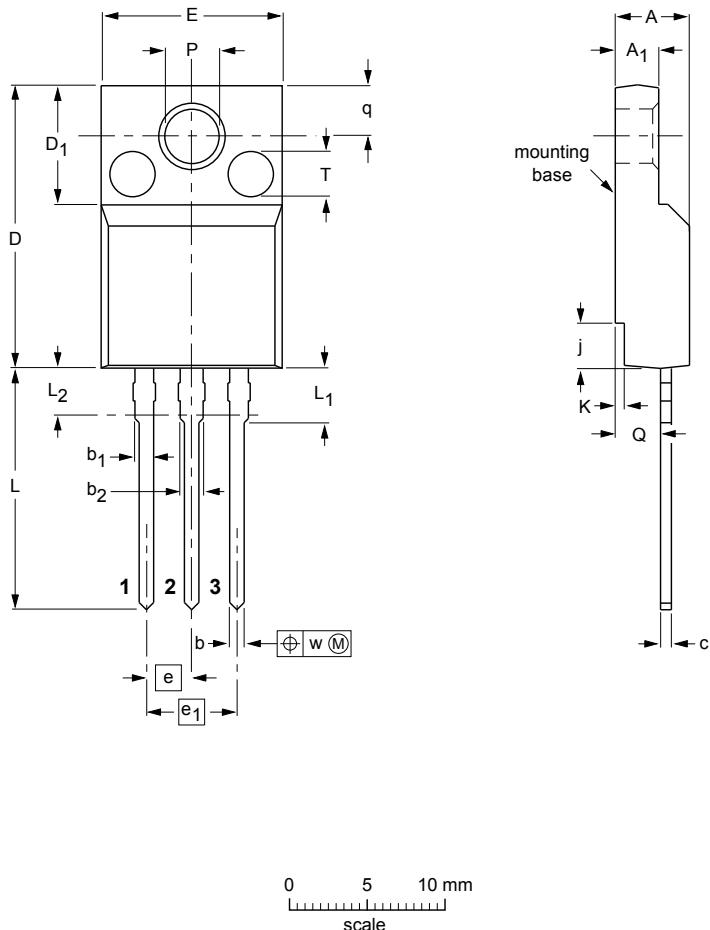


Fig. 11. Normalized gate trigger voltage as a function of junction temperature
