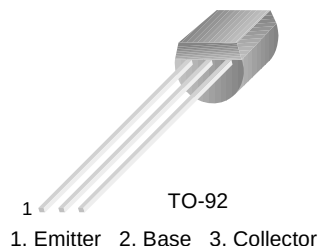

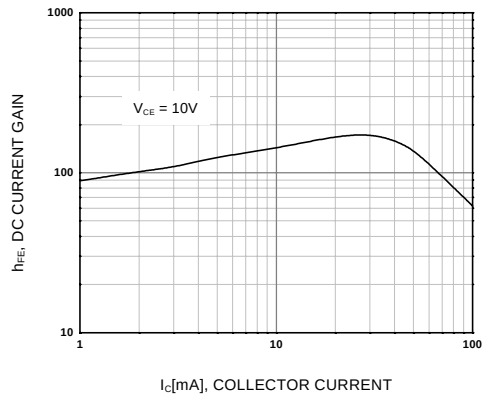


Figure 1. DC current Gain

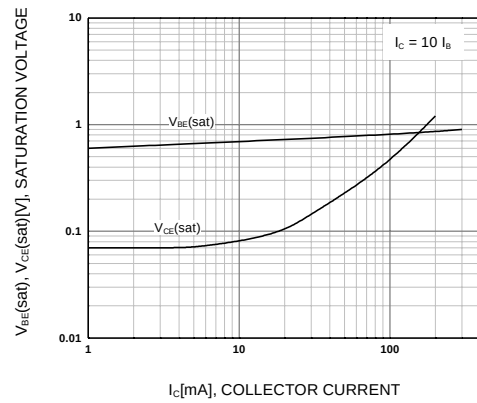


Figure 2. Collector-Emitter Saturation Voltage
Base-Emitter Saturation Voltage

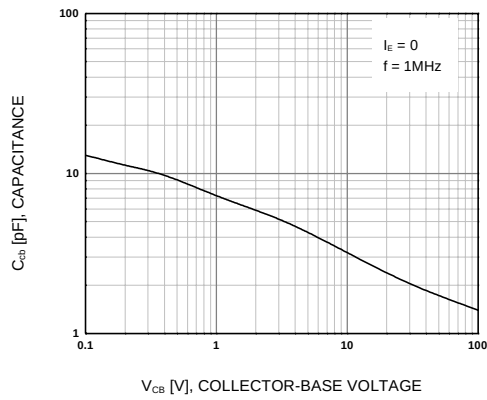


Figure 3. Collector-Base Capacitance

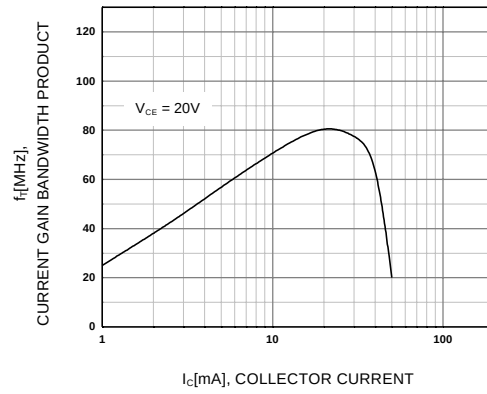
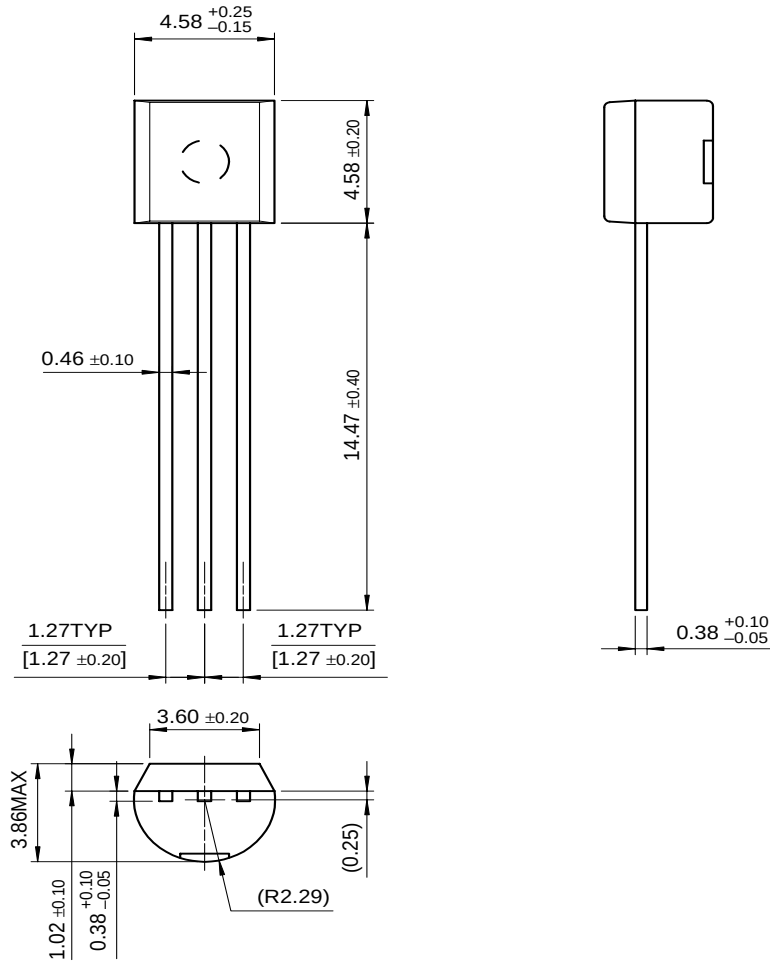


Figure 4. Current Gain Bandwidth Product
