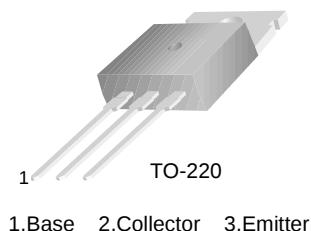

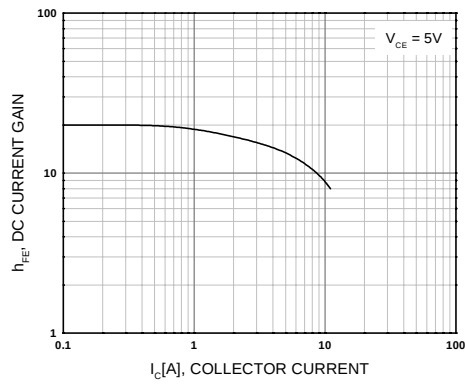


Figure 1. DC current Gain

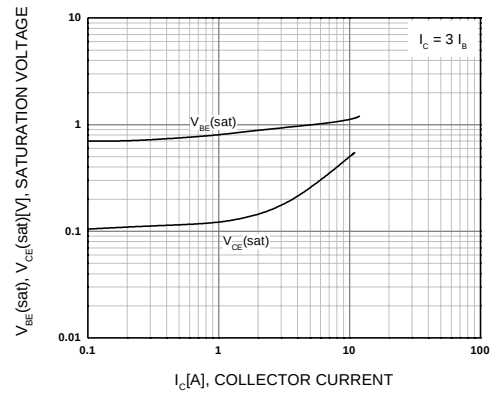


Figure 2. Base-Emitter Saturation Voltage
Collector-Emitter Saturation Voltage

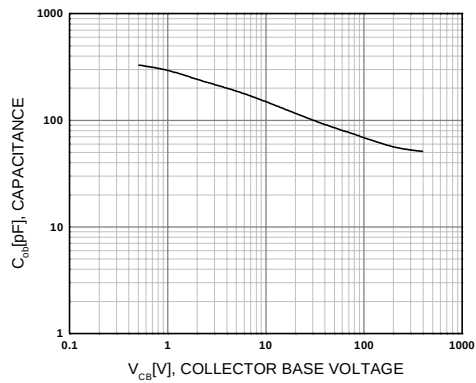


Figure 3. Collector Output Capacitance

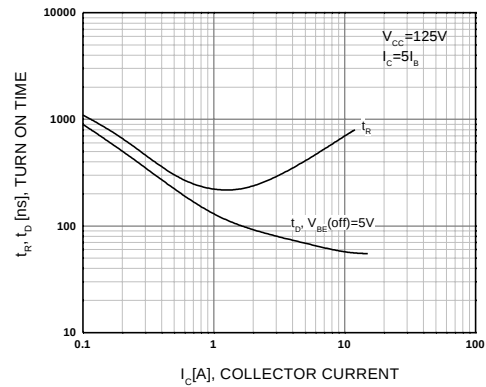


Figure 4. Turn On Time

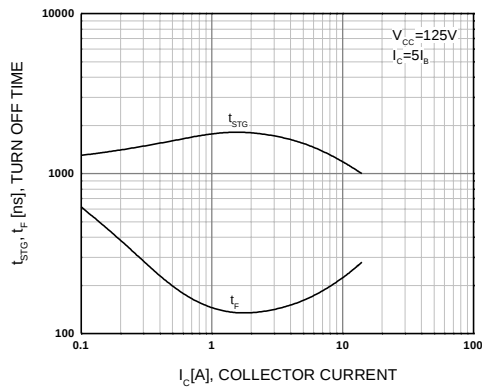


Figure 5. Turn Off Time

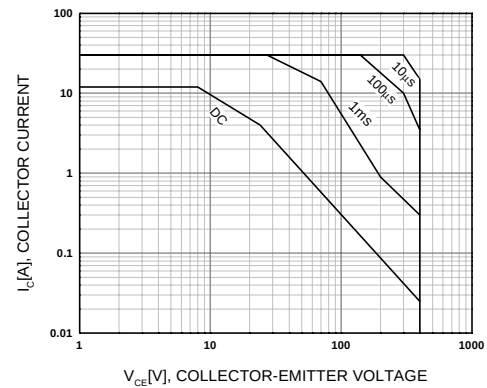


Figure 6. Forward Bias Safe Operating Area

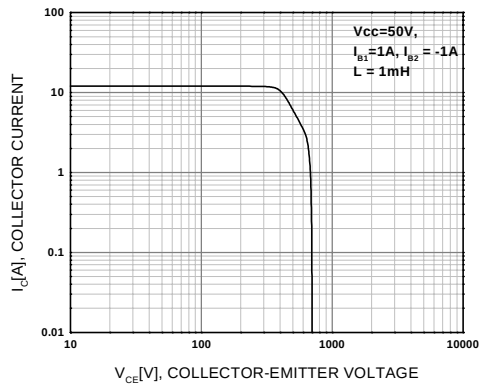


Figure 7. Reverse Bias Safe Operating Area

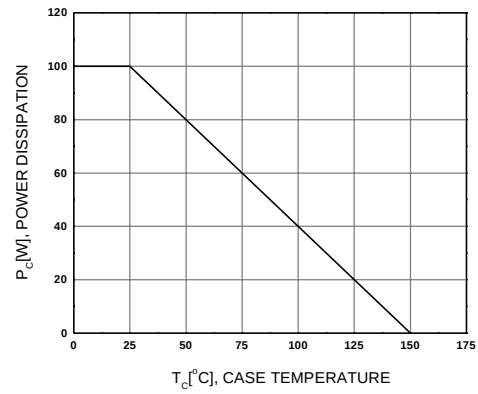


Figure 8. Power Derating
